

Man Cut When Car Is Wrecked

Carvin Bode, 30, Seymour route 4, suffered cuts and bruises at 1:25 o'clock this morning when a car slid off Road 46 two miles west of Columbus, hit a fence and utility pole and came to a stop in a cornfield.

Two other occupants of the 1955 Chevrolet escaped injury, but Harold Lewis Pollert, 34, 606 South Lynn street, Seymour, driver, was charged with reckless driving. Willis E. Pollert, Brownstown route 2, was other occupant.

Mr. Bode, identified as an employe of Indiana Gas and Water company, received a deep cut on the chin and other facial and hand lacerations. He was released after treatment at the county hospital.

Sheriff officers said the car was being driven west and went out of control after going over the rise east of Rocky Point road intersection. The car slid on the snowy pavement and went into a field. Damage was estimated at \$450. Deputy Sheriff David Hilycord, Jr., investigated.
