

Paul E. Underhill, 80, ex-Indiana Gas worker

Paul E. Underhill, 80, a former Lafayette resident, was found dead in his home at 2241 W. Jefferson St., Kokomo, Thursday, apparently of a heart attack. He had been in failing health for the past three years.

Mr. Underhill worked for Indiana Gas as a meter repairman until 1954. Later, he did odd maintenance jobs.

Born on Aug. 28, 1910, in Colburn, he grew up and was educated in Lafayette. He lived in Lafayette and the Chicago area before moving to Kokomo 15 years ago. He married Florence Morinsky in Lafayette in 1932. She died Jan. 6, 1971.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Barbara Workman of Greentown; a son, Max Underhill of Citrus Grove, Calif.; three brothers, Wayne Underhill and George W. "Bill" Underhill, both of Lafayette, and Donald Underhill of Indianapolis; and a sister, Gwendolyn DeVault of Rensselaer.
