# Heating help still available past today's deadline

An estimated 186 Tippecanoe County residents today could lose immunity from disconnection of their natural gas services. And another 750 could face disconnection with their next utility bill, local officials say.

Throughout the winter, residents who signed up for the Energy Assistance Program were protected until March 15. But record-high bills—some as high as \$800—prompted area service agencies to draft a plan for families in crisis.

and Community Action Programs, which services Tippecanoe, Carroll, Clinton and White counties.

Last week, representatives from Area IV, Lafayette Urban Ministry, Salvation Army and Fairfield Township Trustee met to create a procedure for Fairfield Township residents to seek help.

Fairfield Township includes most of Lafayette and the rural area north of it, bounded

by the Wabash River, Beck Lane, County Road 400 North and County Road 500 East.

To date, at least 162 Lafayette residents on the EAP had made no payment on their Indiana Gas bill since Dec. 1, said Indiana Gas spokesman Mike Roeder. Another 361 Lafayette residents were behind on their Indiana Gas bill by at least \$50, he said.

Even more Indiana Gas customers are at risk of disconnection in the next 60 days, said Mary Anderson, Lafayette Urban Ministry
